

Minutes of Previous Meeting:

Graham Wells circulated the minutes from the previous meeting. Moved accepted Rod Pringle seconded Dennis Maher. Carried.

<u>Motorsport Australia and CMC.</u> Barry Cockayne reported by email. Items of interest to the Club were:

- -It was the first meeting of the newly elected executive and Chairman, Darren Barlow, who is a SCCA member.
- -Newly elected board member, Jon Thompson is also a SCCA member.
- -The ARDC has introduced a new tracking system, My-Laps, at SMSP which is GPS based and provides live information to Race Control on the position of each cars well as visual information to the driver. It is currently in the final phases of development.
- -Admin Support Officer, Mat Anderson, provided information services for clubs including workshops on grant writing and on recent amendments to NCRs.
- -Due to trackside officials safety concerns EVs are no longer eligible for State Championship events.

Barry was unable to attend the CMC meeting or 60th year anniversary lunch but reports will be available in the Preserve.

Membership: Ross Richardt reported:

We have 345 members.

One new application and one re-applying this month

- -Phil Hargans of Concord who has a Mk1 Sprite.
- -Hiranjan Welagedera is re-applying.

Moved accepted Ross Reichardt, seconded Greg Holden. Carried.

Ross is preparing membership renewal notices to go out before he goes away. All present agreed to leave the fee structure as current.

CSCA & Competition: David Baigent reported by Email.

- -As of 14th March we only have 45 entries and we need 60 to break even.
- -A number of key officials have become unavailable for the event. This is the major problem as we have very few qualified officials in the club. A number of the committee are willing to volunteer for positions but not qualified for the key roles.

If we cannot fill these key positions we could end up running a poor event or cancelling at the last minute which is a poor reflection on the club.

-After extensive discussion the following was decided.

Greg Holden will talk to David Baigent about contacting CSCA and see if we can get official assistance from another club. The key issue is finding a Chief Scrutineer.

Ross Reichardt suggested we absorb any loss from the low entry number. The maximum would be a few thousand dollars.

Moved Greg Holden, seconded Ross Reichardt that we try to get officials by Friday 17th March. If we can get officials we run the event regardless of the entry numbers. If we cannot get officials we will have to cancel. Carried.

<u>Regalia:</u> Avis Fowler reported:

-Currently off-loading some merchandise stocks. We need to order more hats.

Sprite Torque:

- -March edition finished. Cut-off date for April is March 20th.
- -Elise needs more articles.

Website and Facebook:

Facebook: Harley Pringle reported we have about 1000 members on Facebook and the interest is mainly runs, photos and general social activity.

Website: Ross Reichardt reported that he has done some work on the site. The main problem has been in updating the events section but the site update will solve this.

Ross is also tidying up the format and presentation of the site.

Defensive Driving:

- -There was some discussion on the name Drive to Survive which is a business name, now used for a F1 program. It was decided to call it the SCCA Defensive Driver Program.
- -Due to extenuating circumstances, last years selected candidates have not been able to attend the course. Greg Holden to contact Colin Dodds about the program.

General Business:

- -Rod Pringle asked about the Club Pointscore. Graham Wells advised that Brian Walton has agreed to run it this year using the previous rules. We will back date it to the start of the year. Avis Fowler to send social attendance lists to Brian Graham Wells will send Phillip Island competition results off Natsoft. Graham Wells to send Pointscore details to Elise Manewell for Sprite Torque.
- -Dennis Maher asked if we can run another Viva la Difference event. Avis Fowler will look into it.
- -Avis Fowler asked about the Club Concourse. Graham Wells advised that he has followed up re All British Display Day and it is being planned for September but ABCC are waiting for a firm date from the Kings School.

Dennis Maher asked about the proposed "letter of the month" for Sprite Torque. Dennis will put some ides together.

Club Point Scores and Perpetual Trophies

Number & type of awards:

1. Club Championship

Is awarded to the Club member who gains the highest total of points in the combined Drivers and Social championships.

2. Sprite Drivers Championship

Is awarded to the Club member who gains the highest total of points in competition driving a Sprite or Midget in the designated events. The designated events are all rounds of the CSCA championship plus two NSW state events and one Interstate event. The state & interstate events are selected by the member & the results emailed to the Point Score secretary within four weeks of the event.

In the case of Sprites or Midgets with engines or gearboxes other than from a Sprite or Midget they will be classed as Associate cars.

There will be no division between race or road cars.

3. Associate Drivers Championship

Is awarded to the Club member who gains the highest total of points in competition driving a non-Sprite or Midget. The designated events are the same as the Sprite Drivers Championship.

4. Social Sprite Championship

Is awarded to the Club member who gains the highest total of points driving a Sprite or Midget at designated social events. Sprites or Midgets with alternative engines or gearboxes are allowed. The designated events shall be all week-end events listed in the Club calendar in Sprite Torque or the Club web-site plus the Tuesday evening events. Any member who is required to take an alternate vehicle to support an event can nominate a Sprite or Midget, limited to two events per year, by Email to the Point Score secretary within four weeks.

Points will be allocated from the event attendance sheet. Members are asked to list their membership numbers on the sheet.

5. Social Associate Championship

Is awarded to the Club member who gains the highest total of points driving a non-Sprite or Midget. The designated events shall be the same as the Social Sprite Championship.

6. Ladies Championship

Is awarded to the female Club member with the highest points total in the Club Championship.

7. Junior Championship

Is awarded to the Club member under 18 years of age with the highest points total in the Club Championship. This will require members to note on competition results or attendance sheets that the member is a junior.

Points Allocation:

Competition events:

Twenty points for being the fastest Sprite/Midget, decreasing by one point for second etc down to a minimum of five points.

Twenty points for being the fastest Associate car, decreasing as above.

Club members acting as officials at the designated events may claim ten points by notifying the Point Score secretary by Email within four weeks of the event.

Social events:

Twenty points for attending a week-end event.

Ten points for attending a Tuesday evening and Friday Drive event.

Perpetual Trophy Awards

B.M.C. Perpetual

Awarded to first place in the Club Point Score.

Drivers Championship

Awarded to first place after combining Sprite Drivers and Associate Drivers point scores.

Sprite Championship

Awarded to first place after combining Sprite Drivers and Sprite Social point scores.

Associate Championship

Awarded to first place after combining Associate Drivers and Associate Social point scores.

Ladies Championship

Awarded to the female with the highest score in the Club point score.

"SPRITE" Social Trophy

Awarded to first place after combining Sprite Social and Associate Social point scores.

Juniors Championship

Awarded to the Junior with the highest score in the Club point score.

Sprite Torque Clubmanship Award

Awarded by the committee to the new member who they think has contributed the most in their first few years of membership. This is not connected to any point score.

The 34th VHRR Phillip Island Classic 10/11/12 March 2023

The 2023 PI Classic was the 34th Classic conducted by the Victorian Historic Racing Register and the 19th Classic that my "Little Green Car" and I have competed in. Excluding the unique Mount Panorama track, Phillip Island is my favourite track, and a race track in which our agile 1275 cc Sprites and Midgets prove surprising fast.

The track's only two "hard stops" are Turn 4 (Honda) and Turn 10 (MG) - with both corners presenting passing opportunities under brakes for our 1275's.

But even more importantly, both corners are followed by turns that allow the 1275's to progressively rebuild their momentum while those turns also prevent the more powerful cars from putting all their power to ground; unlike at a track, like Sandown, where the three hard stops are followed by straights that allow more powerful cars to overtake 1275 cc Sprites and Midgets while our smaller cars take time to rebuild speed.

This year, the Group S Racing Association worked with the VHRR to provide an excellent program for Group S. With 80 entries, the VHRR allocated two grids for Group S but rather than divide Group S on a class basis - which sometimes results in mismatches of performance - the Group S field was divided on race times.

The faster Group S cars lapping quicker than 1:55.00 - such as 911 Carrera 2.7 and 3.0s, Stingrays, Shelby GT350s, Dato Z cars and Alfetta GTV 2.0 litres - were grouped together and labelled the Group S "Bomber Squadron". The remaining cars comprised the Group S "Mosquito Squadron".

Of the seven 1275 cc Sprites and Midgets, Simon and Damien Meyer took up the challenge of keeping the Bombers honest by qualifying 8th and 9th, in 1:53.62 and 1:53.68 respectively - an impressive performance indeed.

In the Mosquitoes qualifying, Bryce Rogers put his Sprite - Simon Meyer's old yellow car - on pole with a 1:56.21. Closely followed by Warren Hotz on grid 3; with Brian Weston, Peter Kaiser and David Baigent on grids 7, 18 and 20. Greg Prunster drove the Group Sa 998 cc Bugeye coupe onto grid 32.

After Qualifying on Friday morning, five races followed on Friday afternoon, Saturday morning and afternoon, and Sunday morning and afternoon.

During the meeting, the eight Sprites all ran consistently, apart from Simon Meyer who had a DNF in Race 2 and a DNS in Race 3 - to fix a front wheel hub - and Warren Hotz, who changed a gearbox on Friday evening.

During Simon's absence, Damien, driving among the Bombers, put down a fastest lap of 1:53.20.

Thank you to Brian Weston for the article and to Phil Wisewould for the photos from the event.

The meeting concluded late on Sunday afternoon with the Mosquitoes Race 5, a 7 lap affair. That race produced an impressive result for the Sprite marque with Bryce Rogers winning, Warren Hotz and Brian Weston 3rd and 4th, David Baigent 12th, and Greg Prunster bringing the Group Sa Bugeye home 18th, with a fastest lap of 2:16.01.

All in all, an outstanding weekend of historic motor sport at the challenging and scenic Phillip Island race track - and all the more better if you were driving a fast, agile Sprite.

Membership Renewals

It's that time of year again - memberships of the Sprite Car Club are due for renewal. Please note that club membership renewals are due by June 30th, 2023.

It is very important for club members to understand the relationship between having club membership and having a car on historic (HVS) or classic (CVS) registration. Either HVS or CVS registration is dependent on the owner of the car holding current, valid membership of the car club. That means that even if you have a valid registration for the car, it will still be deemed unregistered if you don't also hold current, valid car club membership.

Therefore, it is very important to understand that if you have not renewed your membership by June 30, your club membership will lapse and that will invalidate any historic or classic vehicle registration you hold through the Sprite Club. In short, without current, valid club membership your car will become unregistered and will be unable to be driven legally.

As in previous years, you may renew your club membership online or by more a more traditional form.

For online renewals, you will be sent an email from the club with a link to access the online login form. The email contains more information about renewing online.

If you would like to renew via a traditional form, you can get the form from Sprite Torque, or you can download the form from here: https://spriteclub.com/wp-content/uploads/2023/03/MembershipApplicationRenewal.pdf. Once the form is complete, return it to me for processing.

No matter which way you renew your membership, you will need to pay your membership fees before I will issue a new membership card. At this time of the year, membership renewal gets hectic, so please put your member number and surname on the direct deposit, so that I can correlate your payment with your renewal. If you don't identify your payment to the club, then I won't process your membership quickly. I prefer payments to be made by direct deposit to the club's bank account and the account details are on the membership form.

For personal reasons, this year I won't be able to process any renewals until early June but don't delay until then! And remember, if you have a car on HVS or CVS registration, current club membership is critical.

The Fright Reborn

Many readers would know of <u>The Fright</u>, and if you don't I suggest you pay a visit <u>The Garage</u> on my website <u>www.SpriteParts.com.au</u>.

<u>The Fright</u> has lain unloved but not forgotten at the back of the at the back of the garage for about ten years, while I have been busy restoring customers' cars. The last big job drove out of the workshop a week ago, so we rolled <u>The Fright</u> in.

The first task is to strip it down to a rolling shell, with engine and gearbox still in position.

For some reason, the front inner mudguards have been replaced with aluminium panels. They are extremely weak and are showing signs of metal fatigue cracks and patch repairs. They were just pop-riveted in position, so we have removed them. The battery tray and washer bottle tray were also pop-riveted in place, so we removed them also.

The master cylinder, brake pipes and callipers have been removed.

The Fright has a very wide transmission tunnel, quite unnecessary since it has an E-Type Jag diff in a cradle welded to the chassis, so the tailshaft isn't going up, down or sideways. The wide transmission tunnel results in a very cramped seating position for the driver.

We have notched the engine mounts so that we can move the engine slightly to the left. That means we can redesign the transmission tunnel, and at the same time move the left side of the footwell further to the left, giving some room for the clutch foot. These modifications will be done by Brendan at The Hills Prestige Car Repairs, and of course he needs the engine and gearbox in place.

Once the new transmission tunnel and footwell have been fabricated and in place, we will get The Fright back and strip it down to a bare shell. The shell can go off to Redistrip to remove 55 years of paint and rust, so Brendan can then start on the body repairs. The Fright desperately needs new sills, rotted through no doubt from many years on the salt-covered Winter roads of the UK. We will also get Brendan to tidy up some of the rough welding that is evident in a few places.

I would like to thank my friends Bryan Wells and Gary Pope for their continuing assistance and encouragement. If anyone else has an hour or so to spare, I'm certain I can guarantee you an experience that you're unlikely to forget.
