On the home front the doors for the shed are coming along nice and should look a treat when they are finished. I am looking to clad in either Western Red Cedar or Hemlock and either will look very nice. They should make the place look much neater and protect some investments along the way.

Fire season soon and we have a few pile burns to do in the coming months. A few are quite large, and it will take a bit to get them organised and ready to go.

We were lucky to have Martin as our tour guide. He is an ex-QANTAS employee (as are many of the volunteers) who was not only very knowledgeable but quite chatty about various stories attached to the aircraft.

The tour started off with the 747, we walked up the stairs before heading through the cabin, galley, and cockpit. Martin was certainly in his element giving us all sorts of historical information and background of the aircraft.

Then we headed into the hangars to see the Constellation. Again, we walked through the cabin and realised how much smaller airlines were before the 747 entered service. In the hangar with the Connie were numerous other aircraft. A DH Vampire, Mirage, F-111C. Also on display were a PC3-Orion, DC3 / C 47, Canberra bomber, P-2 Neptune, Catalina, CAC Sabre, and a Fokker Tri-motor as a replica Southern Cross.

Martin was such an enthusiastic guide answering our questions, the PA announcement came on for Martin's group to return to the café as lunch was waiting for us. Lunch was a pre-order from their menu. There were plenty of choices and from everyone's comments, we all enjoyed lunch. The HARS café had certainly done well.

After lunch, Martin suspecting that we were enthusiasts, took us upstairs to the function room to see aircraft memorabilia with many of Australia's prominent aviators on display.

Thanks to Michael Benton from the Mini Club who organised the day and allowed us to join them for the tour. It was worth the trip. A great day out with the opportunity to get close to the aircraft. It would be a great trip for kids and grandkids.

My life with Sprites

I still remember about 40 years ago, my dear friend Tim Kelly who was a car dealer (and is now sadly departed) rang me and told me about a Bugeye sprite he'd heard about. Very original, low kilometres and in the country. I seem to recall it was in Muswellbrook. He asked if I was interested, and I was. I seem to recall it was \$3,300.

So, I bought her. She was in good condition, no rust and I enjoyed her for a few years but then I decided I wanted to restore her to perfect. She was my first classic car except for a few Rileys and Hillmans in my youth.

So we pulled her apart and took her to Classic Autocraft at Mortlake. About \$16,000 later and three years I got a perfect body and paint. No filler at all and sensational paint. It took about another 12 months and my friend Paul Reay and his father to finished assembling her and she was magnificent as anyone whose seen her over the years will know. Originality was my aim, and I even found a set of original rubber mats.

I of course had joined the Sprite Car Club and spent a year as president. I attended many Sprite Challenges mainly for the concourse and comradery and still close to Brian and Anne Walton and Beryl Taylor from the day. We were close to Barry as well. He was a wonderful man. I still miss him.

She won a few concourse and I loved her to bits but my sons had started racing karts and I only has a single car garage and the kart was on a stand at the front of the garage. I became paranoid about the kart falling onto the Bugeye and so after a year or so I made the decision to part with her. She was sold for \$21500.00. A world record price at the time. About 40 years ago.

I think I still regret selling her but I could buy her back now, but the price is a bit high and she has deteriorated a little over the years from when I sold her.

She was an interesting exercise.

So my sons, Damien and Simon raced karts for over 25 years at State and National level and won many titles. Many of you will know they now race a Midget and a Sprite to very good effect.

After Karts Damien raced Formula Ford for a few years also to good effect with a 5th at Bathurst in a National level race and many places at State level but eventually I decided it was too hard to be as competitive as we are, and I parted with the Van Diemen.

We didn't race for a few years but Greg Prunster, who I had introduced to Sprite car Club kept saying that Damien could race Cecil any time he wanted.

After a few months we took him up on the offer and our racing career was underway. Simon was working in the UK at the time. I remember that first meeting like it was yesterday. It was at Oran Park, the track was a bit damp and Damien qualified 4th in a big field. In front of him was a Porsche, I think a Big Healey and another Sprite driven by Dave Barlow!

Everybody looked at Damien and wondered who this newcomer was. He certainly let them know and he raced Cecil very successfully for a few years.

After a few years of MG and Prod Sports Racing Greg decided he wanted a car to beat the V8 MG's and Syd was purchased. After a lot of development and a sequential 6 speed gearbox Syd has reached her potential. We were racing against Nipper Taylor and while we never quite got to beat him often, we got to spend a lot of time with our dear friends Barry(rip) and Beryl. Syd was very fast and Damien drove her well as well as racing Group S at the same time.



Then Dr Bob rang me one day and asked if Damien would be interested in driving for him in a Group S car that he'd just built. As they say, the rest is history. Damien drove for Dr Bob for 4 years to great success. Bob maintained the car and we paid for tyres and entry fees. Damien stirred a lot of interest and Greg Prunster became our pit manager. Actually Greg has always been our pit manager and much of our success is due to Greg, Dr Bob and now Chris Dimmock and Phil Parkinson have joined our pit crew.

After 4 years Bob decided he couldn't afford to keep paying the bills and offered to sell me the car at a very favourable price. Bob kept maintaining the car and came with us to every race meeting and Damien drove the wheels of that car. He gathered quite a few fans as the giant killer, and everybody knew who he was, and he is much admired.

Several years later, Simon returned from UK and of course he wanted to race like his brother. Greg Prunster volunteered Tigger and we proceeded to improve Tigger because of course Simon wanted to be as fast as Damien. We spent a lot of money and Dr Bob developed Tigger to her max, but she had her limitations so the mechanicals from Tigger went into a new shell and that's what you see today. The two brothers are so competitive with each other, and they regularly run 1st and 2nd in Group Sb. They beat lots of more powerful cars like Porsches, Corvettes and Shelby Mustangs. They regularly run at the front of Group S and compete with each other as they always did. Their race times a remarkably similar and Dr Bob still prepares our cars.

We have raced Group S for over 10 years and Simon has won the Group S Presidents cup for the past two years with Damien 2^{nd} or 3^{rd} .

During the last 15 years I've accumulated a few Classic cars. It's one of my great loves.

About two years ago I was browsing a Sprite/Midget UK racing page and I saw a "Sebring Sprite" for sale for 18,000 pounds which seemed reasonable, and she looked beautiful. I made some enquiries about Sebrings, and I was hooked and I bought her. It took 5 months to ship her from UK. She has spent some time at Dr Bobs, and I must confess to not using her much yet. But I'm back in Sprites again.

Sprites have always been close to my heart and will remain so.

Membership Renewals

It's that time of year again - memberships of the Sprite Car Club are due for renewal. Please note that club membership renewals are due by June 30th, 2023.

It is very important for club members to understand the relationship between having club membership and having a car on historic (HVS) or classic (CVS) registration. Either HVS or CVS registration is dependent on the owner of the car holding current, valid membership of the car club. That means that even if you have a valid registration for the car, it will still be deemed unregistered if you don't also hold current, valid car club membership.

Therefore, it is very important to understand that if you have not renewed your membership by June 30, your club membership will lapse and that will invalidate any historic or classic vehicle registration you hold through the Sprite Club. In short, without current, valid club membership your car will become unregistered and will be unable to be driven legally.

As in previous years, you may renew your club membership online or by more a more traditional form.

For online renewals, you will be sent an email from the club with a link to access the online login form. The email contains more information about renewing online.
