

President's Report

Hi all,

I hope you are all well and are starting to enjoy the runs in more temperate weather. Although 37/38 Degrees in spring is not really normal.

The club has a number of things on the trot at present. Pizza at the Dickies will be great fun and I know that Leah and I will enjoy the day. Following on from this we will have the AGM. Liz and Graham have been kind enough to open their house for us to enjoy a BBQ and a casual afternoon. We are going to try and hold a rego day on the same day, and I will have the scanner and laptop set up ready to go. We encourage as many members as possible to attend and get their cars signed of for another 12 months of conditional rego.

Leah and I have been busy, and our pet animals continues to grow, the cat passed away (was a bit sad) and then we managed to buy 3 sheep which quickly became 6. Twins for one mum and a brad of a kid for the other. The dog is happy and he reminds me of Sam and Ralph from Looney Tunes. He sits and watches and then watches and sits. He is a clever dog. Leah is loving sheep school, and it is a religion on Saturday morns to take the dog for training. I hope that she takes up trails of some sort in the next few months. That might mean a bit of travelling and I think it would be good fun. I have always enjoyed time in the car with Leah and as long as the dog does not slobber too much it will be OK.

That means fences need to be fixed. I dug out all the sand and soil that was washed down stream and had completely taken up the depth of the fence. 1200mm of soil deposited after the dam overflowed in last year's floods. All the posts were snaped off at ground height and there is a bit of work to do there. The back fence is coming, however we need to build a creek crossing before we get there. This means 2 900mm pipes 2.4 wide being laid down and stabilised. I have managed to get the neighbour to let me use his tipper truck and Excavator to gather some stones to lay a rock wall. It should look nice once completed and will allow access to the back paddock behind the creek.

We have been playing with a stationary engine lately and 5 months soaking in diesel and the odd rocking has seen us finally free up the piston. Its is 150mm in diameter and around 200mm long. Now we can start and re-build the head and valves etc. We purchased this engine (McDonald Super Diesel) from approximately 50KM west / Northwest of Guyra in the New England region. It was a good buy and was still on its original transporter. It had been in the same family all its life and Leah and I were lucky enough to pick it up. More shedding is required, need to talk to Leah.

I hope you will hear from me again before Christmas is upon us.

CHANGING DIFF RATIOS

A simple job I have performed many times in the past. My Austin A35 is in need of longer legs on the Highway, so I scratch through my race car spares and come up with what I thought was a good 4.2 unit and duly installed it the car (this is all same same as Sprite & Midget). Alas, 'The diff was noisy' So remove Diff and replace the original.

Now having the offending 4.2 Diff on the bench and having studied the parables of the workshop manual I decided to replace the bearings and reset the crown wheel with the correct back lash of five thou, but first I had to manufacture a suitable bearing puller to remove the bearings from the carrier, which I successfully made this out of a couple of rear wheel bearing hubs, and all is good, with the new bearings at great cost and the diff turns over like brand new.

So raise the A35 in the air install the jack stands, remove and replace the diff, put the car back on the ground and full of confidence go do the road test. Arrrr Arrrr. NO difference the dam thing is still noisy, probably OK for an open car but not for a little sedan. Back to the shed, raise the car etc.etc.and laying on my back under the car to perform the task. With the drive shaft disconnected and out of the road hanging of a Al. patent wire hanger, it was remove diff from the housing. All was good until I some how I managed to bump the drive shaft off the wire hanger and smacking me in the 'moosh'. Sydney Zetland Factory Report

Introduction:


- The following short presentation contains some historical information surrounding the establishment of the BMC/Leyland factory located at Zetland, Sydney. This consists of information that I have recalled from my period of employment at Zetland between 1964 and 1974, (the era of flairs and safari suits) when the factory was closed. Bought by the Australian Government it was then used as a Royal Australian Navy storage facility then demolished for high rise. I have included names of people that I have been associated with because as in all workplaces it is the people who are important, they leave an indelible memory behind and they should not be forgotten.

Factory Construction:

- Lord Nuffield (William Morris) in talks with NSW government
- In 1947 Lord Nuffield purchased the former Victoria Park Racecourse, Sydney as the site for a car assembly plant. Nuffield Australia opened their new, 57-acre (23 ha) assembly and factory building in March 1950. The facility was initially set up to assemble Morris Minor and Morris Oxford models from CKD kits (complete knock down). Previously these cars were imported into Australia as fully assembled vehicle.
- In the years 1948 and 1949 the Austin A40 was the top selling car in Australia.
- Construction of the press shop (also known as Fisher & Ludlow) included pits below the heavy double action draw presses to allow room for the air cushions, hydraulics and scrap conveyors. When excavation reached one meter in depth the water table was hit requiring pumps to be in operation 24/7 to allow for concrete pouring so that construction of the building could be completed.
